



## Progress Update

As we near the end of our second term as Ark Chamberlain Primary Academy, I wanted to write to all parents and give you an update on our progress.

Many of you will be aware that we had our second Ofsted monitoring visit last week. I am not allowed to share the results of this with you until they are officially confirmed, but the report should be public in the next 3-4 weeks. What I can say is that I remain confident that the academy is on the road back to outstanding.

Pleasingly I know that our pupils generally talk positively about the changes in the academy. I know that they feel safe and enjoy coming to school. However, I am aware that, for many of them, they have already had a number of different class teachers this year. As a parent of three children myself, I understand that this will be a concern to you, as it is to me. However, I would like to reassure you that my top priority is to ensure that all pupils in the academy have the very best teachers. This means that some teachers choose not to continue with us because they are unable or unwilling to meet our high standards, or have simply chosen to move on. In addition, I refuse to take new teachers onto our staff unless I know that they have the potential to be outstanding. This means that we still have a number of supply teachers supporting us.

Despite these challenges, we are gradually improving the situation and have had four new teachers join us in January with another four joining us for the summer term. We hope to be fully staffed with permanent teachers by September.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank you all for your support, which is truly appreciated.
