



## Plans for next year

We have been working hard in the academy to plan for the next academic year and ensure that we raise our standards even further. We are now in a position to let you know about some of our most exciting plans for September onwards.

We are going to be offering a much broader curriculum next year and can promise that music and art will feature much more regularly. In addition, we are planning to increase the number of educational visits that our pupils take part in so that each pupil goes on a visit at least twice during the year. For year four pupils and year six pupils, there will be a special residential visit. In year four this will be a stay in the countryside with a number of challenges related to nature and in year six, it will be a visit to London to see a number of the capital's sights.

In the meantime our pupils, as well as continuing daily writing, will undertake a number of different projects and visits so that they can go onto their secondary schools ready for the new challenges ahead. SATs results will be available in early July.

PS We are currently talking with our uniform supplier about having an optional uniform sports hijab with academy logo from September.


## Meet the staff . . . . .
